Dear Sir,

In reply to yours of yesterday we fitted up the wiring and lamps under the library at T.C.D. and the Corporation brought in the cables from the Grafton Street and fixed a transformer under the Library window. A year later we wired the Provost's House and the Corporation fixed a transformer and joined it to their main as it passed. It was also arranged that we were to wire[&] light the Examination Hall and the Corporation were to fix a transformer in the cellar and join it to the same main. Our order for this lighting at the Examination Hall was afterwards cancelled for some reason. Lately we have altered the Holders etc in both Reading Room and Provost's House for the Corporation and are to exchange the lamps shortly when the Corporation remove the transformers and bring in their 200 volts current. This will most likely be in a few days now as we altered the lamps in Forrest's of Grafton Street and Walpole's in Suffolk St. both of which have now 200 volts current. I cannot say whether the mains with a 200 volt current would bear more lights or whether the Corporation would agree to give more current as they have refused to extend their lighting to several applicants lately as their stations power has reached its limits. I will however ask if possible tomorrow at the Power Station and let you know.
