Dear Professor Fitzgerald

There are always so many difficulties to be encountered in dealing with important questions in Ireland, that the question of Technical Education cannot fairly be exempted from that ordeal, speaking generally. I cannot however admit that the differences of opinion which as you say "necessarily

exist "on their destination,
should be - or are being,
used" as an excuse for
doing nothing, was for
the purpose of saving
money & trouble to the
great injury of Ireland.

At least I must dis-
sociate myself from any
such purpose or action.

I had not heard of any
strictures on your action
with reference to this matter,
but I am of course aware

to some extent of your views,
having read some
expressions of them in
print some time ago.

I still trust that the
action which the Government
may take with reference
to Technical Education
may prove more reasonable
than you appear to
anticipate.
