My dear Fitz Gerald,

I lost no time in
carefully reading Green's report &

in print as soon as possible - as I
am going to England on the 6th
pro. - to make arrangements for my
topical tour - & shall be
away quite 3 weeks - I would
like to settle this business before
I go, if possible -

Could you look after this
report - don't let Moss know
I have written to you - as I have

already spoken twice to him
about it & I don't want to
appear to worry him too much.

He has far too much
to do; it seems to me that
having so much Society business
to do, it is a great pity that
he is liable to be called off to
give evidence in trials!
