I have got the analysis from Johnson & Matthey and it certifies that the medal is an alloy of gold & silver under 20 carat, so that the density determination is fully justified. It only cost 10/6 to get this assay. I have not seen the medal since it was scraped at the edge, as I told Johnson & Matthey to keep it, in case further analysis were required: I also was afraid of trusting it to the post.

I presume now it will be necessary to communicate with Mess<sup>rs</sup> Johnson and get them to supply another medal in place of this one, so that even if it is a bit injured it is not of any serious consequence, for



you will, no doubt, return this one after defacing  
it.
