Fishing Commission. as my idea

from another stand point and
in no way to clash with them

last week it has been working
for 15 years and the owner

who is a great fund of mines gave me a lot
of help. As this is all "old fisheries" so it
must be struck out

you will no doubt see some
difficulties as I have some things I have
I have justly well called the "East. Soc. Fisheries"
